The last few months have been very productive for the IRF. An office has been set up with Sue Liell-Cock as Administrator. This has hugely assisted communications and we request that all contact be done through this office. All membership applications, queries and up dates will be handled through here as well as communications on competitions, other organisations and all aspects of the IRF, including those detailed below. We have been working on various criteria and as details are finalised we will be putting them on our website for everyone's easy access. If they are not on the website yet, please contact this office for your copy.

IRF Race Rules

These have been drawn up and finalised and are available on the website. These rules will be used for World Champs, Continental Champs and any other official IRF events and are a guideline for countries to use for their national events.

Bid Documents

Bid Documents for a host country to hold the IRF World Rafting Champs or Continental Champs have been finalised and are also now available. The Continental Champs bid is open to flexibility. The World Champs are still heavily dependent on sponsorship, so please keep in contact if you have any possible options here.

IRF Standard Guide Requirements

The initial stage laying out guide requirements has been completed and the next stage of guide training is being worked on. It is hoped that these standards are accepted by all rafting organisations around the world.

Competitions

We are drawing up a rafting competition calendar, which will be kept on the website. Please let us know of all competitions being held in your country.

Camel White Water Challenge 1999 and 2000

A communication has been sent out already detailing what is happening and who has been invited to compete. The CWWC is an IRF approved event and gives it its full support, just as the CWWC has given the IRF its support. It will be run according to the IRF Race Rules with some special exceptions being made. The Kayak race is for points and the Time Trial is not; and the point structure is slightly different. The invitations to this event are dependent on the country being a member of the IRF by April 1999. Other teams have a chance to get to the 1999 CWWC by competing at the European Champs. The top team not already invited will be included for 1999.

In February 2000 the event is going to the Futalefu in Chile. Selection for the countries / teams for this event will be based SOLELY on Continental Selections. The 1999 Continental Selections must be held, according to the IRF rules, by 15 December 1999. Please contact this office to ensure your Continental Selections will be approved by the IRF. All participating countries must be members of the IRF prior to competing. The number of teams qualifying per region is as follows:

North America - 2, Latin America (South and Central) - 2, Africa - 2, Europe - 6, Asia - 2, Oceania - 1 and Host - 1. This totals 16 men's teams. Women's teams will be N. America - 1, Europe - 1, Oceania - 1 and the 4th will be a wild card (determined by the CWWC on merit).

Members and membership applications

The following countries had joined the IRF by the time of this letter: Czech Rep, South Africa, Belgium, Slovakia, Russia and Japan.

To join the IRF:

- 1. Form a National Rafting Organisation in your country that is representative of all rafters.
- 2. Send us a summary, in English, of the following sections of your constitution: Aims / Objectives of the organisation, Membership Criteria, ie. who can join, voting and decision making, ie who votes your committee in.
- 3. Send us the list of the committee members, their positions and contact details for the organisation.
- 4. Pay the US\$500 membership fee.
- 5. Fax the declaration through to this office.

We hope to hear from you all soon and that you all had a very Festive Season, whether it was in the snow or the sun!

COMPETITIVE RAFTING

2001 was a year of great international competitions. The *IRF World Champs* were held in West Virginia, USA and despite the awful tragedy of September 11, most teams still made it and showed great international unity in the face of this world intimidation. The event was well run and thoroughly enjoyed by the 11 men's and 5 women's teams that made it. Germany came away with the top honours with Italy second and Czech Republic third. The women's section was won by the Czech Republic, with Slovakia second and the USA third. For moredetails, check www.rapidpulse.net.

The final <u>Camel White Water Challenge</u> event was held on the Zambezi River earlier in September and saw the domination of the European teams broken and southern Hemisphere teams doing verywell. Australia came away as the champs, followed by Canada and then New Zealand. The women's section was won by New Zealand for the 3rd time in a row, followed by USA in second and South Africa in 3rd. This was the last CWWC as Camel have now pulled out of sponsoring the event.

FUTURE EVENTS

<u>WORLD CHAMPS</u>: We are hoping to run the 2002 IRF Champs in Tasmania in December. This is dependent on sufficient sponsorship coming through and this will only be finalised by the end of May. Whether this event happens or not, World Champs will be held in 2003. Various venues are being investigated for this and more details will be given at a later date.

<u>EURO CHAMPS:</u> If any country is interested in holding the 2002 IRF Euro Champs, please contact as soon as possible. As soon as more definite news is known we will let you know.

OTHER EVENTS: There are other international events being held and we suggest you keep an eye on our website, www.intraftfed.com, to keep up to date with them. At this stage we suggest you look at the Czech Republic's calendar of events which has an international event early June and the Europa Cup and Gumotex Cup events. Italy's calendar is also available on the website as are the coastal rafting events in Belgium. The USA events can be found on www.rapidpulse.net and include the Clear Creek event in May and the Gauley event in September. Indonesia usually hold an annualinternational event and New Zealand held their festival in February.

COMPETITIVE RAFTING

XV ITALIAN Rafting Championship 2002 Valsesia International Trophy – Save the river 1st June 2002 – Scopello (VC) – Italy (International teams welcome)

The Czechs are the Mens World Rafting Champs! After being so close the last 4 World Champs (2nd, 3rd, 4th, 2nd), they have at last secured that elusive 1st place! Congratulations! And **the New Zealand Women took back their crown from the Czech women's team** making it the 3rd time they are the Womens World Rafting Champs - well done!

The general response from competitors is that the race venues were excellent for racing and that the race organization was flawless. The thanks must go to the volunteers, sponsors, teams, supporters, Czech organisers and all the others involved and particularly to Stan Hajek and Robert Kazik.

It was an excellent turn out with 24 countries being represented and a new record of 10 womens teams, which is very promising for the future of women's rafting internationally.

We are always wanting to extend our contact to all those that raft and so are always pleased to make contact with individuals, companies and organisations that have these same interests.

Recently the IRF was invited to a rafting seminar in China which was successful and it seems that future contact and growth between us is viable. China has a huge potential for rafting and could be a great source of new adventures for the ever hungry guides. They have also shown an interest in future competitions.

1) IRF CONGRESS 2002

1) 2003 IRF WORLD RAFTING CHAMPS

The World Champs are drawing near very rapidly and teams are scrambling to finalise their entries. We are looking at at least 22 countries being represented at the event, possibly even up to 29! Out of those entries we are looking at about 11 women's teams, which is an excellent number and shows how competitive rafting is on the increase among women. In Norway and Britain it seems the women are more organised and competitive than their men as they are only sending womens teams!

The event promises to be highly competitive and organised as the top teams from around the world prepare to face each other and the Czechs, who are very practised at running numerous large rafting events throughout their season, get everything and everyone in order. We hope you all have welcomed in the New Year with enthusiasm albeit with great sadness for the plight of those in Asia and for all those that have lost loved ones in the Tsunami.

The year is a big one for us all as the World Champs will be held this year in October in Ecuador. The rafting news has poured in over the last few weeks so this has become a long and newsy letter!

2) RAFT RACES

a) WORLD CHAMPS 2005 If you are wanting to race a team in the WRC 2005 then the following are the criteria that you need to satisfy:

i) Your country's rafting organisation must be a fully paid up member of the IRF;

ii) your country must have held or will be holding fair and credible national selections to choose the best men's and women's teams to represent your country.

b) COPA AMAZONAS, Ecuador (same venue as the 2005 World Champs)

The Copa Amazonas 2004, prelude to the 2005 WRC, was successfully held by Club Rafting ECUADOR on the Quijos river in Ecuador from October 27-31. Eighteen teams from the Czech Republic (2 women, 5 men), Russia (3 men), Slovakia (1 women, 1 men), Japan (1 men), Brazil (1 men), USA (1 men), Venezuela (1 men) and Ecuador (2 men) competed at the same sites where the next WRC will be held from October 12-16, 2005. The event was especially important for the delegations from Czech Republic (women and men) and Russia (men) as they used it to select which of their top two teams from their national championships will represent their respective countries at the 2005 WRC.

The winners of the Copa Amazonas 2004 were: Women - Czech Women 2 / Troja/Stan Prague (Jezinky) and Men - Altai-Raft (Russia). The complete results can be found at www.raftingecuador.org

Importantly, the flow of the river is controlled by Trevallyn Dam located some 10km upstream allowing a measured flow (900ccs) that is predictable in terms of difficulty and hazard management.

h) AUSTRIA - For the Rafting season 2005, Sportklub Wildalpen are organising the official International Austrian Rafting Championship 2005 (R4) on the river Salza in Styria and invites all Rafting friends to this event in Wildalpen Styria. The plans for the 2005 WRC to be held in Ecuador next year are moving on smoothly. The Ecuadorians themselves are very excited to be hosting a world championship of this nature. 2) EURO CUP



KZN teams shine in rafting challenge

14 December 2006

The KwaZulu-Natal mens and womens rafting teams shone at the final leg of South African White Water Rafting Championships, and set in concrete their places in the team to represent South Africa at the World Championships, to be held in South Korea in 2007.

The third and final leg of the South African Championships was held this weekend on 40 cumecs of water immediately below Inanda Dam, just outside Durban.

Teams of six powered their way through the waves, dodging gaping holes in the unnatural Tops Needle rapid that is notorious for ending many a top paddlers race in the annual Dusi Canoe Marathon. With an additional water release, courtesy of Umgeni Water, the rapid provided some challenging rafting and exciting spectator entertainment.

The three races (slalom, sprint and downriver) that made up the event were dominated by the KwaZulu-Natal mens and womens teams, confirming that they are the best representatives for the country and have earned their slots.

The slalom race proved particularly challenging, to the extent that one upstream gate was completely left out by all except one of the teams earning a 50-second penalty in each run.

The only team to slice their way across the upper reaches of the rapid, daringly dropping over a number of dangerous pour-overs to successfully reach the illplaced gate were the KZN mens team, giving a preview of their world-class skill in the raft.

Second-placed in the mens slalom was the Lost Vikings team from Durban, although their navigation through the course would have had any hardy captain make them walk the plank.

Third were the Wits mens team who lost members of their crew on their second run and along with it any good score they might have achieved on their first run. The rules state you must cross the finish line with all members of your boat on board. Second to the KZN womens team were the ever-present Wits women.

The sprint race was an exciting one with two womens boats racing head to head. The KZN women, who started on the slower outside lane, stretched ahead in the initial few strokes, winning the faster current and placing themselves firmly between the second boat Wits women and the finish line. Any attempt to pass would have put the Wits team in the hazardous water on the outside of the main channel and they opted for the safer route, tailing the KZN team into a graceful second place.

The mens race was a calamity of rafts and paddles, as any route through the rapid would do in the rush for the finish line. The KZN men took the title once again.

The third event, downriver, was held in scorching midday heat on Sunday. The cool water was a relief, not only from the sun, but to soothe exhausted muscles at the end of the race. The course was quite a taxing one, incorporating lengthly flat stretches interspersed with rapids that required careful navigation so as not to get beached on rocks.

The KZN mens and womens teams came out on top, followed by the Wits women and the intrepid Lost Vikings in the womens and mens races respectively.

The Vikings held true to form and proved they are quite apt, as long as there are no gates to traverse.

The mens team members (including reserves) to represent South Africa in South Korea are Deon and Sven Bruss, Bruce Campbell, Guy Collyer, Brett Frost, Shaun Griffin and Craig van Heerden.

The womens team selections are Kate Frost, Lea Herbst, Nicky Irvine, Kirsten Oliver, Hilary Pitchford, Alice Rawlinson, Jeanette Walder and Jackie Fourie.

The World Championships will be held at the end of June 2007 and will host the top teams from around the world on a technical river near Seoul in the icheon Province.

The South African teams will need to be fit and technically tuned to fare against the other teams and will begin a strict training programme including technical practice on a number of KZN rivers and the sea in the build up the World Championships.
